Bob Rutherford '74 graduated from the University of Arizona in 1978, earning a degree in Aerospace Engineering. After a long, successful career in the Navy and aerospace industry, Bob is now retired and living in Coronado, CA.

Bob served in the US Navy from 1979-2008, holding the position of Fighter Pilot, Captain (O-6). He specialized in carrier-based naval aviation, operational light attack, and strike fighter aircrafts worldwide— and is a veteran of several Southwest Asia campaigns. As a former test-pilot, he has also flown extensive developmental and operational flight tests, particularly for carrier suitability and weapons system integration.

After retiring from the Navy, Bob joined the private sector and worked in the defense aerospace industry for 10 years as a Program Manager at Northrop Grumman Corp. Here, his focus was mainly on military unmanned aerial systems (UAS) development, UAS airspace integration policy, and program management. He held leadership roles in Northrop Grumman's Fire Scout, Triton and X-47B UAS programs.

As an undergraduate, Bob was active in several student organizations including Primus, Sophos, Chain Gang, Bobcats, ASUA, and, of course, Tau Kappa Epsilon. His involvement with the university has continued throughout his life, with recent recognitions of the University of Arizona Alumni Association Professional Achievement Award (2019) and Wildcat Mentor Society Mentor of the Year (2020-2021).

Bob remembers his time as a TKE fondly, and credits the chapter for bringing him his "life-long friends."

#### KEN CRAWFORD '77





Ken Crawford '77 graduated from the University of Arizona in 1980 with a degree in Electronic Engineering. After leading a successful career, Ken is now retired in Chandler, Arizona, with his wife Linda. He has three adult children of his own and sits on the Foster Care Review Board to advocate for the needs of children in the system.

Ken began his professional journey at Motorola where he held the titles of Design Engineer, Engineer Director, and finally Director of Space Electronics. When General Dynamics purchased Motorola in 2001, Ken continued his work providing communication and navigation hardware for satellites as Director of Space Electronics until his promotion in 2007.

Through his new role as Director of NASA and Civil Space, Ken's professional focus shifted toward producing satellites for NASA and commercial enterprises. It was this experience that led him to become Vice President and General Manager of Viasat—a hotspot for cutting edge satellite communications technology. Before retiring, Ken grew the division from 60 to 600 employees.

Ken has remained loyal to his university and fraternity as an alumni. He advocates on behalf of the College of Engineering through the Dean's Advisory Board and is currently an Alumni Board Member for Tau Kappa Epsilon. As one of the undergraduate chapter's previous Vice Presidents and Hegemons, Ken has the following to say about his experience:

"KT helped develop me into an adult. The fraternity had leaders I respected and could learn from, men that became my lifelong friends, and I ended up meeting my wife of 40 years through the social activities. Get the most of your fraternity experience by engaging. Whether that's holding office or serving on a committee, it provides a solid foundation of working with teams to get things done. I personally found holding offices in the fraternity helped develop leadership skills that served me well throughout my career."

Before his work at the university, Victor held previous positions of Vice President Sales at both COTY Inc. and Procter & Gamble. He received great accolades at both of these companies, earning the Trendsetter (Top Sales Manager) Award at COTY Inc. and the Chairman's Club (Top Sales Manager) Award at Procter & Gamble. Outside of the office, Victor is dedicated to his community. He is the current Treasurer of Southern Arizona Against Slavery, the HOA President for Snyder Creek Canyon, and volunteers and fundraises for More than a Bed.

Holding previous positions as Director of Federal Affairs for Fleischman and Walsh, LLP and ten years on Capital Hill as Legislative Assistant for Congressman Steny Hoyer (D-MD), Andy's years of expertise have led him to his current role at McAllister and Quinn, LLC. His federal relations and grants consulting firm has 95 full-time employees, 300 contractors, and over 200 clients in the spaces of advanced technology, higher education, and non-profit organizations.

During his undergraduate career, Andy was an active member of both Tau Kappa Epsilon and the University of Arizona Campus. Serving as Co-Rush Chair and an Orientation Leader for incoming students to the university, his pattern of involvement has stayed consistent even as an alumnus. #### **GREGORY OCHSER '17**
















