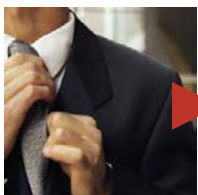

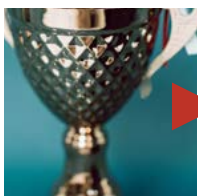
VOLUNTEER

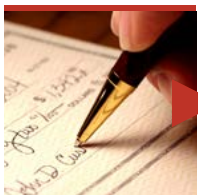

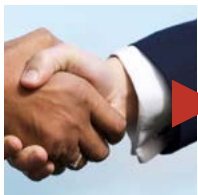

LEAVE A LEGACY

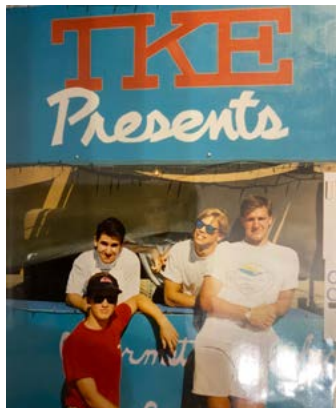

JEREMY GYPTON '90

Jeremy Gypton is the Manager of Public and Academic Outreach at the Ashbrook Center, a non-profit based at Ashland University in Ohio, that focuses on civic education for teachers, students, and citizens. Before that he worked in public education in the Tucson area, teaching and serving in school and district administration. He is also an Army veteran and proud father of two daughters.

Jeremy was initiated into TKE in December 1990, as part of the recolonization class that brought the chapter back to UofA after a several-years absence. He had the privilege of working alongside other (re)founding members to re-establish TKE on campus and positioning the house for a return to Fraternity Row with the construction of the facility on 1st street, now Pima Hall.

Graduating in 1994, he left Tucson for several years, and lost track of most of his KT brothers. Over the last few years, thanks to social media, he regained contact with many from his era of KT and in 2021 was encouraged to get involved with the chapter, with him formally accepting the role of Chapter Advisor in Fall 2021. He is now becoming progressively more involved in chapter operations, assisting its leaders and members in goal setting, improving house culture, establishing and maintaining traditions, and organizational operations and management.

Jeremy is eager to pass along the importance of the bonds of friendship, the rewards of working alongside others, and the special value of TKE membership. As a member who has rediscovered friends after almost three decades, the idea that TKE is "the fraternity for life" has taken on deeper meaning for him and serving as Chapter Advisor is both a way to give back, and to promote for another generation the good that TKE can be.
